### IS ENFORCING

- ⇒ A Drug and Alcohol Impairment Policy in the Workplace, that includes Cannabis and substance testing.
- ⇒ Residents will be allowed to grow up to four plants per a dwelling

### RETAIL SHOPS

- ⇒ Retail Shops are only allowed in the Commercial designated area set out by the Town. They must be at least 250 meters away from any gathering place of children/youth which may include: parks, daycares, or schools.
- ⇒ A Retail Shop can NOT be located in a dwelling where an occupant resides. Individuals will be required to pay a permit and/or business license when applicable.
- ⇒ Signage must be displayed in a way that deters youth and is not flashy to the public.
- ⇒ Edibles will be allowed (once legislation permits).

### CAFÉ LOUNGES

- ⇒ These are NOT permitted as per Provincial Government Regulations.

### COMMERCIAL CULTIVATION

- ⇒ Only allowed in the Industrial area set out by the Town. Individuals will be required to purchase a permit, & fill out an application form.

### IS NOT ENFORCING

- ⇒ Smoking Bylaw– the Town of Churchbridge is going to be following the Provincial Bylaw, which states that, “Consuming cannabis in public places is prohibited to protect public health.”
- ⇒ The Town will not provide proactive enforcement or investigations regarding complaints about Cannabis (i.e. your neighbour is smoking outside & the smell is bothering you).
- ⇒ Where you can grow Cannabis– it can be either outside or inside your dwelling. Residents will not be required to purchase a license or register with the Town. The Town will not require security or safeguards for pets/children.
- ⇒ The number of Retail or Commercial Shops to be set up in Town limits (when legislation permits). There will be no limit on hours of operation.
- ⇒ Commercial cultivators will be able to store producing and processing equipment outside if they so desire.

\*\*All residents MUST follow all required Federal and Provincial Regulations. Furthermore, all residents MUST follow all Municipal Regulations. When there are two laws enacted for any such stipulation or requirement regarding Cannabis, the Municipal Government (the Town) will override Provincial regulations in this instance.

## **TOWN OF CHURCHBRIDGE ANNOUNCEMENT**

New Building Canada Fund- Small Communities Fund (SCF) will provide the Town of Churchbridge with a Water treatment system upgrade. The total project amount is \$2.245 million; however, the Town of Churchbridge will be responsible for raising 1/3 of the project cost totaling \$750,000.

Councillor Russ Thies was on hand for the announcement made in Saskatoon Tuesday, Sept 11.

The project will be completed in 2.5 years and includes:

- Construct approx. 140 m2 building expansion, reservoir upgrades, approx. 12 L/s Reverse Osmosis unit, drainage upgrades, electrical room, backup generator, and all associated works.
- Wells: modifications and upgrades as needed including review by an hydro geologist, pump replacement and electrical upgrades.
- Building expansion: confirming structural capacity, constructing a new building expansion complete with an HVAC system, an electrical system upgrade, modifying existing building, and other associated works.
- Reservoir Upgrades: reservoir structure modifications as necessary to suit the membrane treatment unit and upgrades to the level control system.
- Drainage upgrades: upgrades to drainage within the WTP if determined to be practical during the design stage.
- Reverse Osmosis Unit: treatment unit (including pre-treatment if necessary) and control system including integration of WTP plant controls.
- Backup Generator: Installation of standby power generation.
- Electrical Room: Separated room for electrical equipment including new power distribution equipment, motor control, and all associated works.
- Sewage Pumping Station and Sewage Lagoon capacity review.
- Engineering, Geotechnical investigation, and Hydro geological review.
