Bylaw 2018-006 will be named the “Numbering of Houses and Other Buildings Bylaw.” This Bylaw will provide Civic Addressing for the community that will be used by 911.

The Bylaw will provide a uniform system for the numbering of houses and other buildings within the Town.

#### **Bylaw 2018-006 will include:**

\* A separate number assigned to each property ascending from east to west and south to north, when applicable;

\* Each house or building will bear the number assigned to the frontage of where the front entrance is located;

\*The owner of a property situated on a corner lot (upon request), may be assigned a specific number assigned to the long side of the lot;

\*Property owners permanently affixing a civic number to a unit or building must meet such stipulations stated in this Bylaw;

\*Any existing houses or other buildings not now conforming to this Bylaw, shall be changed to conform with this Bylaw;

\*Penalties for contravention will include a Notice of Violation served by a Bylaw Officer or post-marked through the mail.

**\*If there is non-compliance (ie. if you do not have a civic number on your house or building), there is a penalty of a \$250.00 fine and if there is non-compliance twice within a 12 month period, the fine is doubled to \$500.00.**

#### **2018– A Year in Review**

#### **Things Council has accomplished in 2018:**

- 1) Secured provincial/ federal grant funding for the RO Water Treatment System upgrade slated to be completed by 2021.
- 2) Developed an Asset Management Plan.
- 3) Developed a Strategic Plan.

- 5) Started a Road Patching Maintenance Plan.

- 12) Renewed the Mutual Aid Agreement.
- 13) Developed a Cannabis Policy.
- 14) Revised the Policy Manual.
- 15) Registered in the 911 System.

## Did you know that it costs approximately \$20,000 to replace a lift station pump?

This cost includes: a Hydro Vac Truck disposing of raw sewage, repairing the lift station pump from the blockage, staff wages, a camera to put down the line, steaming the line, and blowing it out. Lift Station #2, located at 317B Prothero Ave West has been clogged three times in the past two months. If this continues to happen, WATER AND SEWER RATES WILL BE GOING UP.

As a reminder: If you use baby wipes, feminine hygiene wipes, diapers, or shop towels, please **DO NOT** flush these products down the toilet. They block our sewer lines and could cause damage to your home or someone else's when the sewer backs up.

### REMINDERS

#### Pet Bylaw

Just a reminder as per Section 2(i), Bylaw 2015-005 states, “Any animal defecating on other people’s property is an infraction of this Bylaw and the owner or keeper of this animal, whether in his/her control or running at large shall cause such defecation to be removed immediately in a sanitary fashion or be subject to a fine.”

Please use a doggie bag and pick up after your pet. Thanks for your cooperation.

#### After Hours Contact

Just a reminder to call (306) 896-7825 after regular office hours, if you see any red or white lights on or if you notice any sounds coming from any of the lift stations. The lift stations are located across from the Town Shop, by the Churchbridge Public School, and at the south end of Cedar Crescent.

#### Contaminated Recycling

In 2018, the Town has spent \$ 1,500 on contaminated recycling. Contaminated Recycling are items that have been put into a blue bin; but instead, they should have been placed into the black garbage bin. Please be mindful when you are filling up your OSS bins! Please see **below** for information regarding Acceptable versus Non-Acceptable Recycling.

#### Acceptable Items to Recycle

Newsprint (not tied in bundles), office paper, cardboard (corrugated), boxboard, household tins, books (hard cover– cover and spine must be removed; books– the binding must be removed), beverage containers (no Styrofoam cups), and plastic (items must be cleaned out and lids removed, if applicable).

#### Non– Acceptable Items to Recycle

Glass, electronics, appliances, plastics (that are not containers), building materials, household garbage/waste, needles, Styrofoam (all kinds), hazardous materials (paint cans, aerosol cans, lighters, batteries), wax coated items, and mixed– packaging or miscellaneous items (deodorant sticks, toothpaste tubes, frozen juice containers, foil from yogurt containers, ribbon for gift boxes, baler twine, cans for coffee/good host ice tea/pringle chips, wire coat hangers, car parts, Keurig coffee pods).
