PAVING 2025

DRIVEWAY APPROACH POLICY

The Town Office would like to remind residents of our Driveway Approach policy. Per policy 6.2 of the Town of Churchbridge policy manual (p.122) available on the Town website or at the Town Office, the Town of Churchbridge has the management and control of every street, including the grade between a taxpayer's property and street pavement or swale ditch. The Town of Churchbridge will approve the finishing (may include pavement, concrete, paving stones or gravel) of any swale ditch on any property in the town that meets the town's specifications. Pursuant to section 4(2) of the Municipalities Act, the town has the right to dig up and remove anything from the swale ditch if it causes drainage problems for the town. The replacement/repair cost will be at the taxpayer's own expense. The taxpayer must agree to and understand that if the grade runway (swale ditch) is not finished according to the town of Churchbridge specifications and should it be dug up, they are liable for the replacement cost of the finish of the swale ditch. Application forms for Finished Drive-way approach are available at the Town Office or on the Town website.

The Churchbridge Aquatic Centre officially opened for the season on June 3rd. Schedules will include time slots for lane swim, 5 & under and quiet swims along with public swim. Schedules are posted on the Churchbridge Aquatic Center Facebook page, the Town of Churchbridge Facebook page and the Town of Churchbridge website. The Churchbridge Aquatic center Facebook page is also where to find schedule changes, notices regarding weather related closures or other information.

LESSONS

There is still room for lesson registration in some of the classes. Please contact the Pool to check space availability. Registration forms can be picked up from the Town Office or printed from the website. Lesson times are posted on the Facebook page and parents of swimmers will be notified directly as well. A reminder that children waiting for their lesson or siblings of registered children cannot enter the water during lesson times. This includes the toddler pool and beach entry end as there are no guards on deck while instructing.

POOL RENTALS

To rent the facility for a gathering, please contact the Pool to arrange. Rentals are charged per hour with a minimum 1 hour rental and rate is dependant on number of attendees. There is a BBQ on site that can be used at an additional flat charge of \$20. We ask that anything you bring with you goes with you, all food is kept to the picnic tables and away from the pool, and no confetti permitted.



DUTCH ELM DISEASE

Please note, pruning of an Elm Tree from April 1—August 31 is ILLEGAL as per provincial regulations. As per the Dutch Elm Disease Regulations, section 5(1): No person shall prune an elm tree during the pruning ban period unless:

- a) the elm tree is damaged;
- b) the person has obtained authorization to prune the elm tree:
- c) the person is an employee of, or is contracted by, the municipality who, in the course of his or her duties or responsibilities, considers it necessary to prune the elm tree to ensure human safety or avoid damage to other property; d) the elm tree is part of a hedge of elm trees that requires shearing.

Removal:

Removal of an elm tree can occur anytime throughout the year (without permission). However, the whole tree must be removed including the roots.

ANIMAL CONTROL

The Town Office has received complaints of Cats at large. Cats must be licensed, which can be done at the Town Office and a tag for ID will be given. Please keep your cat within arms reach, use a leash or keep the feline indoors. Thank you for your cooperation.

Pease pick up after your animals. This keeps our community clean for everyone. There are garbage cans posted for the disposal of refuse and we encourage residents to use them

YARD WASTE PICKUP

The annual fall yard cleaning pick-up dates are as follows:

- September 10
- September 24
- October 15

Please have any garden waste placed in paper bags and left curbside in front of your property. Branches will be accepted in bundles, but must be less than 4 feet in length.

Staff begins pickup at 8 a.m. Please have bags curbside by this time or they may be missed and put out for the next pickup or taken to the transfer site by the property owner. However, yard waste can be taken to the Transfer Site at no charge.

GRASS CUTTING POLICY

Policy 11.6 on p. 147 of the Town of Church-bridge Policy Manual states Property owners are responsible for cutting the grass between their curb stop and the road (boulevard). In addition, any grass along the back alley between the road and the rear of the property is also the responsibility of the property owner. Property owners may convert the section along their frontage to gravel or asphalt at their own expense provided it does not impede drainage. If drainage is impeded, town staff may cut a swale through the section or remove some gravel if necessary to allow drainage to flow properly.
